Diaper & Formula Drive

People Serving People spends about \$21,000 annually (\$1,700 each month) to provide diapers and nutritious meals for infants and toddlers. Our staff and volunteers distribute about 24 canisters of formula each week and 16,950 diapers per month.



ITEMS NEEDED

DIAPERS

Sizes 4, 5, 6 and pull-ups*

FORMULA Similac Advance Formula must be at least two months prior to the expiration date.

*People Serving People does not accept cloth diapers.



Potty Training Kit

Potty Training can be stressful for the parents as well as the child. With these "potty training kits", we can equip parents with the right tools to help make this transition go as smooth as possible.



ITEMS NEEDED

- 1- Potty seat that can go on a regular toilet
- 5- Pull-ups (see sizing information below)
- 5- Pack of underwear (see sizing information below)

1 Potty book

(POTTY by Leslie Patricelli, A Potty For Me! by Karen Katz, Everyone Poops by Taro Gomi, Once Upon A Potty by Alona Frankel, Where's the Poop? by Julie Markes)

DIRECTIONS

1. Place all items in a reusable bag/tote

2. We need the following sizes:

Boys-2T/3T and 3T/4T

Girls 2T/3T and 3T/4T | Gender No

Gender Neutral 2T/3T and 3T/4T

3. Label each bag with a note card that includes which size and gender items are in the bag and on the other side write a one line positive affirmation to the child. Examples: "Way to go!" "Good Luck with Potty Training!" "You're a big kid now!" "You can do it!"



Tie Blankets

People Serving People provides blankets to families as part of a move-out basket when they find housing in the community. Please consider hosting a blanket making party at your home or workplace to help formerly homeless families settle into their new homes.



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Select your fleece blankets. Use two different fleece patterns, two solid patterns, or two patterned fleece.
- 2. Purchase anywhere from 1.5 to 3 yards of each fleece. 1.5 yards makes a throw size, 2.5-3 yards makes a nice twin size blanket.
- 3. Spread out the material. Spread it out so that the softer or more brightly colored sides face out.
 - 4. Cut out a rectangle from both corners with a pair of scissors. Use a card that has been cut to 3" X 5"
- 5. **Start cutting strips.** Cut strips of approximately 1 inch from each corner down the end and the sides for as long as the material lies flat.
 - 6. Tie the corner strips together. Using a simple knot, attach the bottom layer to the top layer.
 - 7. Tie the strips down each side for the length of the blanket .



Book Drive

People Serving People distributes free books onsite through our book nooks and Reading Partners program. Our main goals are to encourage parents to read to young children and to cultivate a life-long habit of reading among teens. Please consider donating new or gently used books your children no longer need or organizing a book drive at your workplace. Please include multi-cultural books for all ages.



ITEMS NEEDED

Baby board books & picture books Elementary picture books & leveled readers Middle & High School chapter books

All books should be new or gently used.



Pregnancy Snack Pack

People Serving People offers 3 healthy meals to families in shelter, but often our Pregnant Mothers need a snack between meals. Please help us provide healthy pregnancy snacks and juice to expecting mothers in between the meals.



ITEMS NEEDED

Juice box (apple or grape juice preferred) Poptart, granola or snack bar

Please place all items in a ziplock bag and include a note of encouragement.



1st Day of Work

When guests at People Serving People obtain employment, the Employment Advocates help them to prepare for their new position. We help them obtain uniforms, transportation and childcare. Please help us make their first day at work less stressful by providing a day's transportation, a snack, and a free lunch.

\$7 Subway gift card Granola or snack bar 24-Hour Pass for Metro Transit

Padfolio that fits 8.5" X 11" notepad 8.5" X 11" Notepad for padfolio Planner 2- Pens
